PAROCHIAL FEES (DIOCESE OF YORK) ORDER 2017

As Chancellor of the Diocese of York I **HEREBY PRESCRIBE AND ORDER** that as from the 1 January 2018 under the Ecclesiastical Fees Measure 1986 as amended and any other statutory or inherent power enabling the following fees will be payable to the Incumbent and the Parochial Church Council upon the grant of a Faculty, by the person or persons for whose benefit the faculty is granted, unless the grant otherwise provides:

Reservation of grave space for a coffin in churchyard	£82.00	£164.00
Reservation of site for burial cremated remains in churchyard	£82.00	£82.00
Burial of cremated remains in church	£164.00	£328.00
Burial of cremated remains in a closed churchyard (save where burials are authorised by general faculty)	£82.00	£164.00
Erection of monument in churchyard under a particular faculty	£82.00	£164.00
Additional inscription under a particular Faculty (<i>being an inscription not authorised by the minister in charge under the Churchyard Memorial Rules 2005</i>)	£82.00	£164.00
Monument or memorial tablet or plaque in church	£164.00	£328.00
Additional inscription on an existing monument or memorial tablet or plaque in church	£82.00	£164.00

NOTE:

1. *These fees are payable on lodging the petition for faculty in the Diocesan Registry.*
2. *The work or purposes proposed may not be commenced or put in hand before a Faculty has been sealed and issued by the Registrar.*
3. *"Minister" means minister in charge of the church or churchyard who is either the incumbent or the priest-in-charge. The minister's fee belongs to the York Diocesan Board of Finance and will be passed by the Registry to the York Diocesan Board of Finance.*
4. *It is the intention of this Order that fees payable to the PCC shall be applied to the maintenance and upkeep of the churchyard, or as the case may be, of the fabric and monuments of the church, either directly or through a capital fund.*
